venue in the Old Town Hall is just so appropriate as we vacate our home of 40 years awaiting renovations .

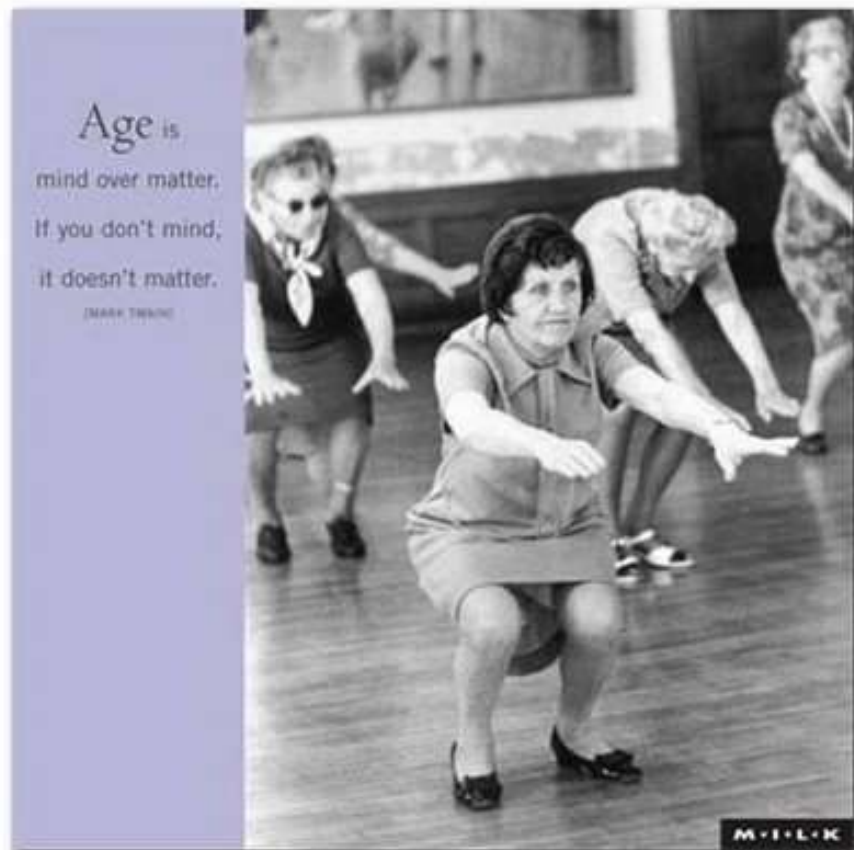

Safety

Session Leaders should note the revised requirements for Safety and the need to appoint a designated Safety Officer for each session, and for a copy of the Safety Instruction sheet to be given to the Safety Officer before the session, this is especially important for the set up and taking down sessions

This is a requirement to safeguard both ourselves and the public coming to the show but is a requirement set by our insurers.

Rosters

It is worth repeating the basis of the rosters.

All sessions where members or partners are rostered have been previously indicated by them as being available, if you can not now attend for duty **it is your responsibility** to find a replacement.

To assist in your search for a replacement, blank sessions against a name indicates they have indicated their availability but are not rostered, sessions with a "0" indicate that person is not available

When finding a replacement please also let the session leader know of your replacement.

We will of course have to limit entry to those who have put their names down in the event that more than 50 arrive on the night!

Please Note the Following Information for visitors to Davies Bakery

All visitors must comply with the following requirements.

Prior to entering the factory:

1. Remove wristwatches, ear rings, necklaces, finger rings, bracelets and any jewellery and put them in an internal pocket or leave them with the receptionist. Rings which are not removable are to be taped or covered with a latex or vinyl glove.
2. Any sores or wounds must be covered by a waterproof dressing and glove.
3. If you have, or have recently had, any sort of gastric illness please advise your guide before entering the factory areas.
4. Do not take handbags or personal effects into factory areas.
5. Smoking is only permitted in designated areas outside of the factory.
6. Protective coats must be fully buttoned/closed.
7. Wear fully enclosed flat shoes. Visitors wearing high heels or open toe shoes shall not be admitted to the factory.
8. All hair must be enclosed within a hair net cap and beards within a beard cover.
9. Hands must be washed with soap and dried at the facilities at the entrance to the factory.

Within the factory:

1. Do not touch or consume products while in the factory.
2. Always stay with your guide and follow their instructions at all times. Do not approach machinery in operation, unless directed. Be aware that forklifts may reverse in factory areas, in which case a reversing beeper is heard.
3. Wear appropriate hearing protection in designated hearing protection areas.
4. If at any time you believe that you have done anything to contaminate equipment or product please advise your guide immediately.

In an emergency:

- Pay attention to emergency tones. An intermittent beep indicates the alert tone which means standby. A continuous tone with or without a voice message is the evacuation tone which means move to an assembly area. If separated from your guide, approach a fire warden, identified by a green or red vest, and follow their instructions or approach any employee for assistance.

Visitors who do not comply with these requirements will not be admitted to the factory. Any visitor identified as not complying after having entered the factory will be directed to leave.
